Reward fund of \$17,200 for information leading to the resolution of these MISSING PERSON OR UNSOLVED DEATH CASES

The Nome Police Department wants to bring as much closure as possible to families of missing persons or victims of suspicious deaths in the Nome jurisdictional boundaries.

We are asking anyone with information on any missing person or unresolved death to contact the Nome Police Department with any and all information.

You may contact any member of the Nome Police Department or the chief of

police directly. If the information is determined to be related to a case in another jurisdiction, we will forward information to the appropriate authority.

A fund has been established offering rewards for first-hand information leading to the arrest or prosecution of individuals responsible for missing persons or unsolved deaths in Nome, or otherwise leading to closure of these cases.

The reward fund is at \$17,200 and

growing, and is made possible by Bering Straits Native Corporation, Kawerak, Inc., Norton Sound Health Corporation, the City of Nome, Golovin Native Corporation, Sivuqaq, Inc., the City of Unalakleet, and Wales Native Corporation.

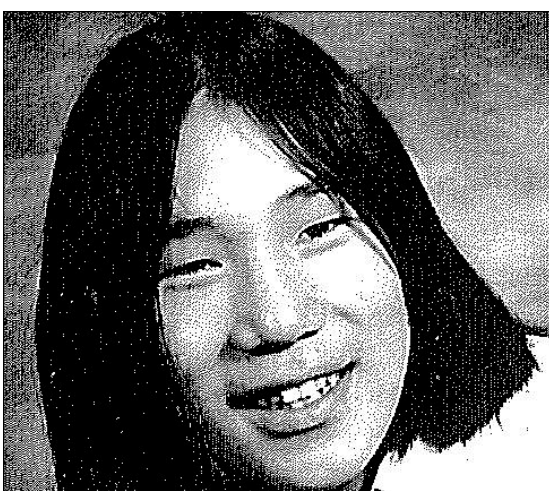

Foster families can also be on call and take in children from one night to 10-15 days, if interested. Many families provide a permanent foster home for a child or become licensed to help with an adoption process.
