Medical Staff Briefing – Megan MacKiernan, PA-C, Compliance Director	<ul> <li>Megan MacKiernan gave updates on the following: <ul> <li>Alaska: 3 new cases in the last 24 hours, 377 cases, 305 recovered, 62 active, no new death in the last 24 hours, 10 deaths total</li> <li>ANMC: 1 inpatient</li> <li>NSHC: 1,012 individual tested, 866 negative, 143 pending (most at ANMC), 1 positive (the one and only case thus far), 1 recovered, no active cases in the region</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
City of Nome Update – Glenn Steckman, City Manager	City of Nome Update:  City is following governors guidelines  May 8 <sup>th</sup> the restaurant can open up to 50%, the restaurants have to follow protocol and have to limit indoor capacity to 50% of people and can only group people to household members, walk ins are now permitted and if you did not have a reservation you will have to log in that you were at the restaurant and having a meal, there has to be signs as there is now stating any customers that have symptoms of COVID-19 must not enter the premises, but best practice is if you are not feeling well to not go to a restaurant for sitdown meal,  Bars will be allowed to open at 25% of seating in the bar at this point  Churches can now allow up to 50 people that can congregate at church; social distancing in a church service (or anywhere) is still important to protect everybody that is in the establishment  The City is still enforcing the state regulations on interstate travel so if someone is coming up from the lower 48 or out of the country, we are expecting them to	

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	quarantine in the City of Nome for 14 days; if they quarantine in Anchorage then come to Nome they will still be required to quarantine in Nome.	
Question and Comments	<ul> <li>Does the 14 day quarantine in Nome include patients that are traveling Nome or patients traveling from Anchorage?         <ul> <li>Yes.</li> <li>If they are passing through, they can quarantine in their final destination.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Are the bars going to be keeping a log like restaurants?         <ul> <li>Yes they should be keeping a log. A city employee will be going to restaurants and bars and giving them the new updated mandate from the governor.</li> </ul> </li> <li>What are permissible activities under quarantine?         <ul> <li>People are not supposed to be going out. People are forgetting to act their dog, so please include it in the plan. City is taking a different approach than the State. The City is going to be putting out a PSA of quarantine expectations. State allows essential services employees go to and from work only. They cannot go to the stores, restaurants etc.</li> </ul> </li></ul>	
	<ul> <li>The City of Nome is following the advice from NSHC on opening and quarantine.</li> <li>Deanna Stang – The State of Alaska is taking a self-police themselves approach. Encourage to take least punitive or less restrictive approach. Encourage the State, NSHC, and City of Nome to follow a consistent message.</li> <li>People that go to AC, Hanson's, and restaurants should be wearing mas and that should be a requirement.</li> <li>Have you seen an influx in birders this season?</li> <li>City of Nome says no, with some of the international citizen, some have said if they leave, they won't be able to go back. Additionally</li> </ul>	
	of the major hotels in Nome is currently closed.  Comment was made that wearing a mask should be a mandate.  Will take under consideration.  What is the number we can call for clarification for travel?  443-6600. Glen 304-1907 if you need to talk to Glen personally.  How do individual organizations addressing push back from people was go into the villages that do not live in the village?	
	<ul> <li>In Wales, medical only travel and the households area required to quarantine for 14 days.</li> <li>MAS: In her family, they have burial that will take place later. Eve community should feel the strengths when they set their travel bans stick to it. Communities have the right choose how to protect them are going to experience a lot of turbidity in the coming months.</li> <li>Dr. Peterson agrees with MAS, and recommends doing it carefully slowly.</li> <li>Comment was made that maybe if there are enough people that are</li> </ul>

What if there are some questions about household situation who should we talk to?  MAS: Mentioned to get a hold of Heather Payenna with Kawerak.  Is NSHC going to provide some advice to the City of Nome on best way to quarantine individuals and going out in the country?  Dr. Peterson will be at the council meeting on Monday. NSHC will have a recommendation for the City of Nome and get Deanna's opinion  Deanna has provided the State's stance to one of the city council members on outdoors.
