Medical Staff Briefing – Dr. Mark Peterson, NSHC Medical Director	 Dr. Mark Peterson gave medical staff update on the following: Worldwide: 10.3 million documented cases of COVID, 500,000 deaths, in the US there has been 2.6 million documented cases and about 126,000 deaths Alaska: 904 cases, 25 additional cases in the previous reporting period which would have been the 28th, we are always presenting two days prior in our call, 21 residents and 4 non-resident, a chunk of those are coming from Seward, 525 recovered, 67 accumulative hospitalizations, 16 people right now with either COVID-19, assumed COVID-19, or suspected COVID-19, 14 deaths ANMC: 0 inpatient, 67 outpatient, 12 employees NSHC: 9 cases, 5 recovered, 4 active, 9,118 total test done, 3,619 unique patients tested, 7,489 negative 8 returned positive, 1,621 pending, 1 positive from an out of state Norton Sound Region resident In regards to the case that was announced yesterday we did send a village response team to that village and yesterday there were 90+ patients tested and believe that we have a majority of those results back and have not gotten any new positives It is going to be a week long process on getting everybody tested that wants to get tested Tomorrow on this call we are going to have a couple of guest, we are going to have Dr. Bob Onders who is the administrator of ANTHC and works with a lot of epidemiology and Dr. Cliff Schneider is who is a disease specialist Please come with your questions tomorrow and they are going to call in right at 11:05 am I have a few questions up front for them to answer and then they will be open to taking questions from all of you Ask questions about testing, antibody testing, rapid test, what research they are doing, what ANMC is doing etc.

Question and Comments	 What villages are testing positive? Dr. P: Recommend you calling the president of the IRA's of the villages in our region that you have travel for and ask them. Did you guys announce that it was a Norton Sound employee that tested positive? I am reading different information and first it was NSHC employee and then a corporation employee. Dr. P: Reba is responsible for NSHC press release and her press release makes it very clear that it was a Norton Sound Health Corporation employee and that's the correct information. Now wher other media outlets pick this up and report this themselves they don'talk to us and they just read our article and send out their own article When they wrote corporation they meant Norton Sound Health Corporation but they apparently didn't say Norton Sound Health Corporation and just wrote Corporation employee which is not correct information you are right but we did not give that to them. A person can write to them and clarify the article is not write and request for them to correct it and we will. Out of the cumulative 67 hospitalization cases how many are specific hospitalized and just test positive for COVID-19? Dr. P: All 67 of those individuals would have had a positive test. They are all in the hospital. We can tell you for certain that they were all hospitalized and they had a positive test. However we can't really know from the data how many of them had COVID-19 as their primary diagnosis. It's possible that they could have been admitted for something else and happens to test positive. I don't think we have that specific data. I would say a majority of them were in for COVII 19 issues. MM: One thing I would add is the 67 cases those patients are all no

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	longer in the hospital but there are 16 that are currently hospitalized. • Dr. P: Of the 16 patients that are currently in the hospital we know that they tested positive but don't know if they are in for primarily COVID-19 or not. There is no way on knowing that and they would
	not report that because it would be too much detail.
